From the Principal...

I grew up outside of town where there was no garbage pick-up. My father and I occasionally hooked up an old trailer and took a load to the county landfill. As an 8-year old I enjoyed these trips because I liked watching the huge bulldozer that compacted the garbage. Guess my entertainment options were pretty limited.

An elderly man was tending the entrance gate on one of our trips. He was a different race than us and poorly dressed. As my father paid the entrance fee I noticed that he addressed this man as "sir" and they shared several friendly comments before we proceeded. Seated in the passenger seat of that old pickup truck, my dad taught me that every person is important regardless of their economic status or race.

My father played basketball and football in school so I learned a lot about these sports while attending games with him. There have been times when he questioned the calls made by referees. He had a sharp eye and good judgement because of his experience as an athlete, but he never threw a fit if he disagreed with a call. He never yelled and he certainly never cursed because of it. He would often say, "Calls usually average out over the course of a game."

I doubt that my father thought he was teaching lessons to his son as we watched games together, especially when the scores were close. It probably never entered his mind that our trip to the county landfill would produce a memorable life lesson for his son. My life would have been quite different if I had witnessed my father talking down to or being rude to others. The lessons learned would have been damaging to me and others for years to come.
